

## ERRATA

Certain omissions on page 5 make it necessary to revise the statement about the western boundary. It should read as follows:

But very soon the Secretary of War, John C. Calhoun, changed it again in a treaty with the Choctaw Indians with the provision that the boundary should run from a point on the Arkansas River one hundred paces east of old Fort Smith due south to the Red River. When the survey was made, however, it ran considerably to the west. The line north of the river was to start at the same place and run due north, but it also veered considerably to the west. In 1875 Congress ordered a new survey to ascertain how much land had been taken from the Indians by the inaccurate survey and paid them for 140,039.66 acres, which were left in the possession of Arkansas. In 1907 Congress took about forty acres from Oklahoma just west of Fort Smith and gave it to Arkansas, but her constitution has never been amended so as to include it.

Page 328, seventh line from bottom: made by the board plus any additional revenue provided for by the Legislature.

Page 329, line 19: ive, and honorary with ten year terms, but the charge has

Page 332, line 11: This will be voted on in November, 1930. At the same election the voters will be asked to vote for or against the income tax law passed in 1929.

On page 375 a statement is given regarding the public debt. Since that was written the Auditor has issued a statement (October 29, 1930), giving the total indebtedness of the State as \$124,255,000, including \$52,000,000 of District Road Improvement bonds. This does not include amounts authorized, but not yet issued.

Page 290, line 21: but it was reversed. The case was finally settled out of court, the miners paying \$25,000 to the coal company.

Definition: The word "galluses" does not seem to have found its way into the dictionaries. In the rural South of a generation ago it was commonly used for "suspenders." See chs. XXV-XXVI.
